REFLECTIONS FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

One evening, I was walking on a path along Lake Michigan on the campus of Northwestern University. I found myself asking God out loud, "What am I going to do with my life?" I entered NU in premed – but had recently discovered that the sight of blood made me start to pass out. Not a great trait for a doctor. I looked up and saw the moon shining down on the steeple of the Methodist seminary on Northwestern's campus. My response? "Oh, okay, I'll be a minister." I had literally never thought about it before this moment. After graduation from college, I started seminary at 21 years old - having very little understanding of what I was getting myself into. I had some vague idea of sitting in my office writing sermons and going and visiting folk, hopefully where homemade cookies and tea were involved. I know – I was clueless!

What I did not know then was that what would be the most meaningful part of being a minister is getting to work collaboratively with the people of my congregations. Pooling our talents and gifts together to achieve something that none of us could do alone. I have experienced countless times the truth of Paul's words to the people of Corinth in I Corinthians 12. ⁴ There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. ⁵ There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. ⁶ There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.⁷ Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. ¹² Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ.

Paul goes on to make it clear that there is no hierarchy of gifts or callings within the body of Christ. It quickly became evident to me as a young pastor that while I felt called to provide full-time leadership as a pastor, that I was surrounded by folk in my congregations who were more knowledgeable about the bible, more deeply connected to Jesus, more effective change agents for good. This has been the great good news – that I could be part of a team where together we could bring Christ's light to individuals, our community, and the world.

This has been on my mind and heart these last few weeks. I am in awe of how you have pulled together as Christ's body at Seaside UMC this last year under very challenging circumstances. Ministry has continued to happen because of the generous sharing of time and gifts on the part of the congregation. You have done a terrific job, my friends! And, I also want and need to acknowledge my dear brothers, Pastor Ron and Pastor Dave, who have given so generously of their gifts this year. We will have a special recognition of them in our service on October 9, along with a time of remembrance and thanksgiving for Pastor John.

I thank God that I get to be on this part of your journey with you!

Unfinished Tasks Francis J. Roberts (*Dialogues with God*)

My father, I am not capable of doing all those things that are demanded of me in the course of a day. For every task I complete, there are numerous other needful duties still left undone. This is truly not a complaint that life is over-burdensome, but rather a cry to You, my Father, for understanding, and for wisdom to improve the situation: Such as how to reach the end of the day with a feeling of some degree of satisfaction in a job well done. It is not restful to, as it were; sleep on loose ends—to be forever uncomfortably aware of the numerous tasks still waiting to be done.

For as time passes, so much of what we have failed to accomplish can no longer be done at all. Surely there must be enough time and enough strength provided to do the vitally essential things. Dear Father, I not only fail to accomplish the task, but lose my sensitivity to Your guidance, and in doing this, I soon have also lost the joy I would have had had I pleased You.

Give Me the First Fruits



Oh, My child, *do not bring Me the unfinished tasks*. There will *always* be work to do. This also can be a snare of the enemy; for he would deceive you into feeling that all work is worthy in itself—that simply to be occupied is good. This is not true.

To sit still, yes, even to have recreation, is sometimes just as important and oft times more so. If you were a hundred people, you would soon discover that you would have a hundred times more unfinished tasks.

I say, *Give Me a heart that has learned how to become quiet and to rest.* Anybody can work. Few people know how to be quiet. Being quiet is not being lazy. Most lazy people are never really quiet. Those who do the least frequently talk the most, and are seldom able to be still and collect their wits.

You, My child, must be able to collect yourself—to take time to absorb the Holy Spirit. For to be *freshly-filled* with the Spirit will bring guidance and direction and wisdom, and the will to do the Spirit's bidding. The purpose of spending time with Him is more than simply enjoying His presence: It is to fit and prepare you for the tasks a hand.

So, come to Me, as I have so often invited you to do—heart open, hands uplifted and empty. Don't bring Me your work. Bring me yourself. It is you that I love, not your enterprises. The more you draw near to Me in singleness of heart, the clearer will be your guidance on life's pathway, and the less danger there will be of your substituting human activities for Spirit directed ministries.

Keep your heart tender, lest your work become destructive.


